Clubroom Rule Amendment

At the June Executive Board meeting, a motion was passed to

amend the clubroom standing rules regarding pets and service animals. This amendment was approved by the general membership on June 17, 2025, and is now in effect. Key Highlights of the Amendment:

- Pets are not allowed inside the clubroom at any time, except for service animals recognized under Federal ADA regulations (CFR 365.5).
- This change is in compliance with San Diego County Health Department regulations for indoor bars and restaurants.
- Pets are allowed in the patio area, but must:
 - Remain on a leash
 - Be under control at all times
 - Be cleaned up after if they relieve themselves
 - Aggressive pets will be removed immediately and not allowed to return.

Copies of the amended rules have been posted on the front and patio doors and have been emailed to all general members, the Sons, and other Legion family groups. If you have any questions or need further clarification, please don't hesitate to contact me directly.


